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Montréal, September 2026 — Joanie Roussy, sempai and director of Shinkyokushin Karate Nuns' Island, won first place in women's kata, age 30–39, at the *2026 Karate Dream Festival International Championship*, held July 18–19 at Yoyogi National Gymnasium in Tokyo. Organized by the World Karate Organization Shinkyokushinkai, the event brought together competitors from dozens of countries across more than 230 categories.

Representing Canada, Roussy prevailed in kata, the discipline that evaluates precision, power and technical mastery of karate's codified sequences. She is one of three Canadian athletes to reach the podium at this edition.

"Stepping onto the tatami at Yoyogi, in front of the best kata in the world, was already a victory. Hearing my name called for first place gave fifteen years of work their full meaning. I share it with my dojo and with every woman who trains with me on Nuns' Island."

AN UNUSUAL PATH

Trained as an early-childhood educator, Joanie Roussy first practiced soccer, figure skating and volleyball before turning to combat sports. She discovered kickboxing in 2010 and Kyokushin karate in 2011, the year she helped Alexandre Haché establish the Nuns' Island karate school. A black belt, she now teaches there and leads the school's women's classes.

KARATE FOR WOMEN

Since opening, the school has welcomed more than 500 children and adults. Roussy's women's classes are designed to make karate accessible to people with no martial-arts experience, with an emphasis on confidence, physical conditioning and discipline rather than competition.
